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11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW_SECTION. Section 1. County governing body to set salary -- changes to be uniform. (1) Except as provided in 7-32-104, the governing body of a county shall annually establish the salaries of elected county officials and other county employees by adopting a resolution no later than March 31.

(2) The salaries established as provided in subsection
(1) are effective July 1 of each year.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. County salary commission. (1)

The governing board of a county may establish a salary commission composed of no fewer than three or no more than seven members to advise the governing board on the level of compensation of county officials or employees.

(2) The members of the salary commission may receive

no compensation, and the duration of their terms shall be established by the governing body at the time of the members appointment.

- (3) No county official or county employee or member of the immediate family of a county official or county employee may serve on the salary commission.
- 7 (4) The salary commission may submit recommendations
 8 to the governing board no later than January 31.

9 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Public hearing and notice 10 required. (1) If the governing body proposes to change 11 salaries for county elected officials and county employees. 12 a public hearing thereon must be held at the same time and 13 place as the hearing on the preliminary budget required in 14 7-6-2317.

15 (2) Notice of the purpose of the public hearing must
16 be published in a newspaper of general circulation in the
17 county at least once a week for 2 successive weeks, with the
18 date of the final publication no more than 7 days before the
19 hearing.

Section 4. Section 7-4-2108, MCA, is amended to read:

"7-4-2108. Mileage allowance for county commissioners

-- expenses. (1) In addition to the salary provided by

7-4-2107(1) [section 1], each member of the board of county

commissioners in counties of the first, second, third, and

fourth class shall receive a mileage allowance as provided

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in 2-18-503 for the distance necessarily traveled in going to and returning from the county seat and his place of residence, each day that such trip is actually made and while engaged in the performance of his official duties.

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- (2) Each member of the board in all other counties is entitled to a mileage allowance as provided in 2-18-503 for the distance necessarily traveled in going to and returning from the county seat and his place of residence each day that such trip is actually made to perform official duties. Any county commissioner whose place of residence is 50 miles or more from the county seat, as measured by the usual route of travel, and who elects to remain more than one day in the county seat to attend sessions of the board or perform his official duties is entitled to receive, in addition to mileage for one round trip between his place of residence and the county seat, \$18 per day as expenses for each day's attendance on sessions of the board while engaged in the performance of his official duties.
- (3) All claims for lodging expense reimbursement allowed under this section must be documented by an appropriate receipt.
 - (4) When other than commercial, nonreceiptable lodging facilities are utilized by a county commissioner, the amount of \$7 will be authorized for lodging expenses for each day in which travel involves an overnight stay in lieu of the

- amount authorized in this section. However, when overnight 2 accommodations are provided at the expense of any government entity, no reimbursement may be claimed for lodging.
- 4 (5) This section does not apply to counties that have adopted charter form of qovernment." 5
- 6 Section 5. Section 7-14-2610, MCA, is amended to read: "7-14-2610. Payment of damages and expenses. All 7 8 awards of damages estimated by the board or made by the 9 proper court and all expenses, -- including -- those -- of -the members-of-the--board--and--their--per--diem--authorized--by 7-4-2107--and-7-4-2100, shall be paid out of the county road fund on the order of the board."
 - Section 6. Section 7-4-2706, MCA, is amended to read: #7-4-2706. County attorney to be full or part time -resolution -- salary. (1) In any county with a population of less than 30.000, the county commissioners may, upon the consent of the county attorney, on July 1 of any year by resolution establish the office of county attorney as a full-time position subject to the provisions of 7-4-2701 and 7-4-2704.  - (2) In any county in which the office of county attorney has been established as a full-time position under subsection (1), the county commissioners may, by resolution

4	"7-32-104. Salaries. The provisionsof-7-4-2503

11	NEW SECTION. Section 8. Repealer. Sections 7-4-2107
12	and 7-4-2503 through 7-4-2505, MCA, are repealed.
13	NEW SECTION. Section 9. Codification instruction.
14	Sections 1 through 3 are intended to be codified as an
15	integral part of Title 7, chapter 4, and the provisions of
16	Title 7 apply to sections 1 through 3.
