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SECTIONS 61-8-311 AND 61-8-323. MCA.=

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING THE DRIVER OF AN OVERTAKEN VEHICLE TO TRAVEL ON THE SHOULDER OF A TWO-LANE HIGHWAY UNTIL HE IS PASSED IF IT IS SAFE TO DO SO; AMENDING

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-8-311. MCA: is amended to read:

"61-8-311. Minimum speed regulations. (1) A person may

not drive a motor vehicle at a speed slow enough to impede

or block the normal and reasonable movement of traffic

except when reduced speed is necessary for safe operation or

in compliance with law.

(2) On a two-lane highway where passing is unsafe because of traffic in the opposite direction or other conditions, a slow-mowing vehicle, including a passenger vehicle, behind which four or more vehicles are formed in line shall turn off the roadway at the nearest place designated as a turnout by signs erected by the authority having jurisdiction over the highway or wherever sufficient area for a safe turnout exists in order to permit the vehicles following it to proceed. If the shoulder of the highway to the right of the overtaken vehicle is wide enough

and is in a condition allowing safe travel. the driver of

the overtaken vehicle may 'drive onto the shoulder and

proceed at a safe speed until passed. As used in this

section a slow-moving vehicle is one which is proceeding at

a rate of speed less than the normal flow of traffic at the

particular time and place. The department of highways is

authorized to designate and construct such turnouts and to

erect signs at appropriate places advising motorists of this

statute.

(3) If the department of highways or local authorities within their respective jurisdictions determine on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that slow speeds on any part of a highway consistently impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic, the commission or the local authority may set a minimum speed limit below which a person may not drive a vehicle except when necessary for safe operation or in compliance with law."

Section 2. Section 61-8-323, MCA, is amended to read:

#61-8-323. Overtaking a vehicle on the left. The
following rules shall govern the overtaking and passing of
vehicles proceeding in the same direction, subject to those
limitations, exceptions, and special rules hereinafter
stated:

24 (1) The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle 25 proceeding in the same direction shall pass to the left thereof at a safe distance and shall not again drive to the right side of the roadway until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle.

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(2) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the driver of an overtaken vehicle shall give way to the right in favor of the overtaking vehicle on audible signal and shall not increase the speed of his vehicle until completely passed by the overtaking vehicle. When giving way to the right on a two-lane highway, he may travel upon the shoulder at a safe speed until passed if the shoulder is wide enough and is in a condition allowing safe travel.

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(2) On a two-lane highway where passing is unsafe because of traffic in the opposite direction or other conditions, a slow-moving vehicle, including a passenger vehicle, behind which four or more vehicles are formed in line shall turn off the roadway at the nearest place designated as a turnout by signs erected by the authority having jurisdiction over the highway or wherever sufficient area for a safe turnout exists in order to permit the vehicles following it to proceed. If the shoulder of the highway to the right of the overtaken vehicle is wide enough 1 and is in a condition allowing safe travels the driver of 2 the overtaken vehicle may 'drive onto the shoulder and 3 proceed at a safe speed uptil passed. As used in this section a slow-movind vehicle is one which is proceeding at 5 a rate of speed less than the normal flow of traffic at the 6 particular time and place. The department of highways is 7 authorized to designate and construct such turnouts and to erect signs at appropriate places advising motorists of this 0 statute.
