In compliance with a written request received <u>January 6</u> , 19 83, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 93</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA).
Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members
of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 93 allows an elementary school that anticipates an ANB of at least 14 but less than 18 pupils to apply for two-teacher funding and to receive an appropriate maximum general fund budget amount.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. All schools between 14 ANB and 18 ANB will be eligible for two teachers.
- 2. The enrollments of the school will remain the same for the next three years.
- 3. The Foundation Program will remain unchanged.
- 4. The number of schools will not change.
- 5. All affected districts levy the 9 mills for the permissive portion of their budgets.
