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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 22-3-112, MCA, is amended to read:

"22-3-112. Cultural and aesthetic projects grants. (1)

Any person, association, or representative of a governing unit seeking a grant for a cultural or aesthetic project from the income of the trust fund created in 15-35-108 must submit a grant proposal to the board of trustees cultural and aesthetic projects advisory committee, in care of the Montana historical society, by secember September 1 of the year preceding the convening of a regular legislative session.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Cultural and aesthetic 12 projects advisory committee — terms and compensation. (1) 13 There is a cultural and aesthetic projects advisory 14 committee.

- 15 (2) The committee consists of 16 members, appointed as follows:
- (a) eight members appointed by the Montana historicalsociety board of trustees; and
- 19 (b) eight members appointed by the Montana arts 20 council.
- (3) Members shall hold office for 4 years beginningJanuary 1 following their appointment.
- 23 (4) A member may be removed by the appointing 24 authority.
- 25 (5) All vacancies shall be filled by the original

appointing authority.

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- (6) The committee shall elect a chairman and 2 3 vice-chairman.
- (7) Members of the committee are entitled to 4 compensation of \$25 a day and travel expenses: as provided 5 for in 2-18-501 through 2-18-503, for each day in attendance 6 7 at a committee meeting.
  - NEW SECTION. Section 3. Advisory committee powers and duties. (1) The cultural and aesthetic projects advisory committee shall review all proposals for cultural and aesthetic project grants before they are submitted to the legislature.
- 13 (2) Consistent with the rules adopted in accordance 14 with [section 5], the committee shall make recommendations 15 to the legislature on each proposal submitted to the 16 committee.
- 17 (3) The committee's recommendations to the legislature 18 are advisory only.
- 19 (4) The committee shall present its recommendations to 20 the appropriations committee of the legislature by the 15th 21 day of any regular legislative session.
- 22 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Cultural and aesthetic 23 project appropriations -- administration. (1) The 24 legislature must appropriate funds from the income of the 25 trust fund created in 15-35-108(2)(h) before any grant for a

cultural or aesthetic project is awarded. 1

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- 2 (2) Costs incurred by the Montana historical society and the Montana arts council for accounting, correspondence, project visits, and solicitation of proposals related to cultural and aesthetic project grants and the costs of the advisory committee established in [section 2] shall be paid from appropriations from the income of the trust fund.
  - (3) Grant proposals approved by the legislature shall be administered by the:
- 10 (a) Montana historical society when they are 11 predominately of a historical nature; or
- 12 (b) Montana arts council when they are predominately 13 related to artistic endeavors.
- (4) The 14 legislature shall designate in the 15 appropriation authorization the responsible administering 16 agency.
- 17 NEW SECTION. Section 5. Rulemaking authority. 18 Montana historical society and the Montana arts council shall adopt rules that specify the criteria the advisory 19 committee shall use when evaluating 20 and making recommendations on cultural and aesthetic grant proposals 21 22 submitted to the legislature.
- 23 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Initial appointments. 24 initial appointments made under the provisions of [section 25 2) shall be staggered in the following manner:

- 1 (1) Two of the members appointed by the Montana
  2 historical society and four of the members appointed by the
  3 Montana arts council shall serve 2-year terms.
- 4 (2) Two of the members appointed by the Montana 5 historical society and two of the members appointed by the 6 Montana arts council shall serve 3-year terms.
- 7 (3) Four of the members appointed by the Montana 8 historical society and two of the members appointed by the 9 Montana arts council shall serve 4-year terms.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 110 proposes to establish a Cultural and Aesthetic Projects Advisory Committee and provides for appropriations for administrative costs incurred by the Montana Historical Society and the Montana Arts Council.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Committee meetings will be held three times during the biennium. The meetings will be of one day in duration.
- 2) Committee members will be representative of all geographical regions of the state.
- 3) The cost of the project vists will be absorbed by each agency's budget.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 110, Amended, establishes a Cultural and Aesthetic Projects Advisory Committee and provides appropriations for administrative costs incurred by the Montana Arts Council.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) There will be three committee meetings in the biennium and will each be one day duration (1 day in FY 84 and 2 days in FY 85).
- 2) Committee members will be representative of all geographical regions of the state. There will be 16 members paid at \$25/day.
- 3) The duties and responsibilities of the .5 FTE are: publicity and advertisement for solicitation of proposals; interviewing and selection of review committee; scheduling and attendance at meetings; receipt, organization and tracking of proposals; handling of correspondence and inquiries; and supervision of receipt and disbursement of funds.

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A statement of intent is required for this bill because it grants rulemaking authority to the Montana Historical Society and the Montana Arts Council for the purpose of specifying the criteria the advisory committee shall use when evaluating and making recommendation on cultural and aesthetic grant proposals submitted to the legislature.

It is contemplated that the Montana Historical Society and the Montana Arts Council will adopt rules that specify the following general criteria that the advisory committee will consider in making recommendations:

- (1) Quality ability/experience of project staff; excellence of performers.
- (2) Cultural impact how important is the project to the cultural development of the state? Will the project stimulate a large number of people or a number of communities?
- (3) Project diversity a variety of different interests and disciplines should be served.
- (4) Geographical diversity to the extent possible;
   the grants should assist the entire state.
- 25 (5) Project costs if grant funds are limited, some

- preference should be given to projects requiring smaller
  qrants.
- 3 (6) Seed money requests will a grant enable the 4 project or its sponsors to generate other funds or otherwise 5 to make the project self-supporting?
- (7) Availability/appropriateness have applicants attempted to procure other funds? Are there other sources that are appropriate?
- 9 (8) Self-help does the applicant seek full funding 10 from coal tax funds, or has he arranged alternate financing 11 to the extent possible?
- 12 (9) Creativity is the project so innovative,
  13 beneficial, and practical that by example it will stimulate
  14 other projects?
