A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ELIMINATING THE MANDATORY RETIREMENT AGE FOR A MEMBER OF THE TEACHERS* RETIREMENT SYSTEM AND REQUIRING A TEACHER INITIALLY EMPLOYED BY THE MONTANA UNIVERSITY SYSTEM AFTER AGE 70 TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE RETIREMENT SYSTEM; AMENDING SECTION 19-4-302, MCA: REPEALING SECTIONS 19-4-305 AND 19-4-803, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 19-4-302, MCA, is amended to read: "19-4-302. Active membership. (1) Unless otherwise provided by this chapter, the following persons must be active members of the retirement system, with the exception that those persons who became eligible for membership on September 1, 1937, or on September 1, 1939, and who elected not to become members under the provisions of the law at that time are not required to be members:

- (a) any person who is a teacher, principal, or district superintendent as defined in 20-1-101;

for House Bill 140 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA).
Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members
of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 140 eliminates the mandatory retirement age for a member of the Teachers' Retirement System and requires a teacher initially employed by the Montana University System after age 70 to become a member of the retirement system.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) The incidents of people becoming employed in the Montana University System (MUS) beyond the age of 70 has been negligible (possibly non-existent) in the last five years. Therefore, the assumption made is that if there are any hirings of such individuals on any of the campuses in the MUS, it would certainly be no more than one per year of the '85 biennium.
- 2) The individual(s) is hired full-time at a salary of \$25,000 per academic year.
- 3) Teacher Retirement System employer rates remain unchanged.

FISCAL IMPACT:
