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Section 1. Section 39-51-2203, MCA, is amended to read:

*39-51-2203. Reduction of benefits because of amounts received from certain other sources. (1) Claimant's weekly benefit amount shall be reduced by the amount that he is receiving from a governmental or other pension, retirement pays annuitys or other similar periodic payment which is based on work for and contributed to in whole or in part by a base-period employer. If-a-claiment-is-receiving-payments wader-the-federal--Seciel-Security-Act--or--the-federal Reilford-Retirement-Act-or-from a pension to which he has contributed in party his weekly benefit amount must be reduced-by-50%-of-the-amount-that-he-is-receiving-from-such payments. However, the amount by which weekly benefits are 1 to be reduced shall be determined by the ratio of the 2 employer's contributions to the fund from which the payment is made so that the claimant will receive credit only for 3 the proportion of his contributions to that fund.
