12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
13	Section 1. Section 37-19-315, MCA, is amended to read:
14	*37-19-315. Funeral costs — rules on disclosure. (1)
15	The board shall adopt rules requiring mortuaries to disclose
16	in writing to all customers a complete itemized list of all
17	funeral costs and complete information regarding the need
18	for embalming.
19	(2) The rules adopted by the board shall allow
20	unlicensed mortuary employees, prior to a determination by a
21	customer as to the mortuary services be desires, to:
22	(a) distribute to the customer a prepared list of
23	prices for mortuary, funeral, and other services and
24	merchandise available from the mortuary: and

(b) identify for the customer. as nearly as possible.

1	funeral-related services and merchandise available from
2	other businesses."
3	Section 2. Section 37-19-316, MCA, is amended to read:
4	*37-19-316. Continuing education requirements. The
5	board may in its discretion establish by rule continuing
6	education programs and continuing education requirements.
7	Compliance with continuing education requirements may be
8	used as a condition of continued licensure. In adopting
9	rules and individual orders regarding continuing educations
10	the board in-its-discretion :
11	(1) may use or rely upon guidelines and pronouncements
12	of recognized educational and professional associations;
13	(2) may prescribe the content, duration, and
14	organization of courses;
15	(3) shall take into account the accessibility to
16	applicants of such continuing education as it may require;
17	and
18	(4) shall avoid any impediments to interstate practice
19	that may result from differences in continuing education
20	requirements in other states <u>w: and</u>
21	15) may not require continuing education for any
22	person who has been in the business of mortuary science for
23	20 years or longers is over 60 years of ages and does not
24	practice mortuary science on a full-time basis.
