A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ANNUAL UNANNOUNCED INSPECTIONS OF LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES BY THE OEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES; AMENDING SECTION 50-5-204, MCA."

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24 25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 50-5-204, MCA, is amended to read:

"50-5-204. Issuance and renewal of licenses —

inspections. (1) After receipt of a new or renewal application and a determination by the department that the facility meets minimum standards and the proposed or existing staff is qualified, the department shall issue a license for 1 year. If minimum standards are not met, the department may issue a provisional license for less than 1 year if operation will not result in undue hazard to patients or residents or if the demand for accommodations offered is not met in the community. The minimum standards which home health agencies must meet in order to be licensed shall be as outlined in 42 U.S.C. 1395 x(o), as amended, and in rules implementing it which add minimum standards.

(2) The department must inspect a new facility before an initial license is granted.

1 (3) An application for renewal of a license must be
2 accompanied by a report, on forms provided by the
3 department, containing such information as the department
4 considers necessary to determine whether minimum standards
5 are being met.

6 (4) The department may inspect a licensed health care
7 facility whenever it considers it necessary and shall
8 inspect each licensed facility. except long-term care

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 328 provides for annual unannounced inspections of long-term care facilities by the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences and amends Section 50-5-204, MCA.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) 48 long-term care surveys are scheduled for FY 1983 utilizing existing staff. 100% annual surveys should add 46 additional long-term care surveys and require two additional surveyors to be hired.
- 2) Salaries for 2 surveyors at Grade 14, Step 1 for 1984, and at Grade 14, Step 3 for 1985.
- 3) Operating expense was based on the average cost per surveyor of existing staff.

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House Bill 328 requires a statement of intent because it requires the Department of Health and Environmental Sciences to conduct an annual unannounced inquiry at each licensed long-term care facility.

The Legislature contemplates that such inquiry should include, but not be limited to, the following:

- (1) Consideration of general resident care and treatment. Including resident's personal hygiene and cleanliness.
- (2) Consideration of the living environment, including cleanliness of the premises.
- (3) Consideration of the residents general well-being and morale.
 - (4) Consideration of the facility's staff's morale.

Further, the process for conducting the inquiry should include, at a minimum, a survey of the residents by written instrument or personal interview, a survey of the facility's staff, a general tour of the facility, and other activity as may be reasonable.
