A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OR CONATION OF ANIMAL MEAT OR PARTS CONFISCATED OR OTHERNISE ACQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS; ESTABLISHING A REMARD PROGRAM WITH THE PROCEEDS FOR REPORTING VIOLATIONS OF THE LAWS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT; AMENDING SECTIONS 87-1-511 THROUGH 87-1-513 AND 87-1-226, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 87-1-511, MCA, is amended to read:

"87-1-511. Sale of confiscated birds and animals. All

Except as authorized by the director pursuant to commission
policy. all birds, animals, fish, heads, hides, teeth, or
other parts of any animal seized by any officer or warden or
otherwise acquired by a department employee in the scope of
his employment shall be sold, under the direction of the
director or wardens, at a time, place, and manner so as to
receive the highest price. The sale shall be at public
auction to the highest and best bidder. The director or his
wardens shall publish notice of the time and place of the
sale, together with a description of the birds, fish,

animals, or parts or portions of animals to be sold, in a newspaper of general circulation published in the county where the sale is to be held. The notice shall be published 3 at least once, and the sale shall not be less than 5 or more 5 than 30 days after the last publication. If the property seized is perishable, it may be sold by those officers 7 without publishing notice of the sale. The property may be R sold upon that public notice and under those terms and 9 conditions which in the discretion of the officers seem 10 conducive to securing full value."

Section 2. Section 87-1-512, MCA, is amended to read: "87-1-512. Certificate of sale. (11 Upon the sale of property a wildlife carcass as provided in 87-1-511, the officer shall issue a certificate to the purchasing party, certifying that the purchaser has the legal right to be in possession of the property carcass and that anyone so acquiring this property carcass from the state is prohibited from reselling or using the same for any commercial purpose. During an auction only one carcass of either deer, moose, or elk may be purchased per person. At its discretion, the department may donate unsold carcasses to welfare departments. public institutions. charitable institutions.

(2) Upon the sale of any wildlife part as provided in 87-1-511, the officer shall issue a certificate to the

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purchasing party. certifying that the purchaser has the
legal right to be in possession of the part. The department
may donate wildlife parts to public, educational,
charitable, or zoological institutions or nonprofit
proganizations. When wildlife parts disposed of under this
section are sold as trophy parts, the department shall mark
these parts in such a manner that they can be identified and
traced."

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Section 3. Section 87-1-513, MCA, is amended to read: #87-1-513. Disposition of proceeds of sale. [1] The money obtained upon the sale of such property shall be paid over to the court before whom the person having the same in possession at the time of seizure is prosecuted or in which prosecution is pending; and if the person charged with violation of the law is found quilty before said court of violation of the fish and game laws of the state, the money received for the sale of said property shall be paid over to the state treasurer and be deposited by him to the credit of the fish and game fund; but should it be found that the party from whom the same was taken was not quilty of any violation of the fish and game laws of this state, said money shall be paid to the party from whom said birds, animals, fish, or parts or portions thereof were taken. No officer shall be liable for any damage on account of any search, examination, seizure, or sale as herein provided.

}	House Fish, Wildlife, and Parks Committee
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A statement of intent is required for this bill because it grants rulemaking authority to the Department of fish, Wildlife, and Parks to adopt rules in establishing a reward program to encourage the reporting of game violations by earmarking up to \$30,000 a fiscal year of proceeds from the game auctions held by the department.

To administer this bill, the department will have regulations or guidelines which would describe standards for the payments, methods of distributing the rewards, and for protecting the anonymity of people providing information.
