WHEREAS, allowing current grazing and cabin site licensees and lessees to continue to enjoy the benefits of existing licenses and leases and the benefits of their labor is a worthy object helpful to the well-being of the people of this state in that it promotes continuity in the care of state lands, promotes use of state lands by the public by granting a minimal expectation of continuing enjoyments and promotes satisfaction with governmental processes.

THEREFORE, it is the intent of this bill to direct that if the Board of Land Commissioners adopts any rules under whatever existing rulemaking authority it may have to establish the market value of current surface licenses or leases, that the Board, in furtherance of the state policy expressed in 77-1-202, adopt a method of establishing the market values of grazing and cabin site licenses and leases which would not cause undue disruption to the lives and property of and useful enjoyment by current licensees and lessees.

INTRODUCED BILL

  - (2) If the board adopts, under whatever authority it may have on October 1, 1983, the method of valuation of surface licenses and leases required by this section, it shall also adopt under that same authority a method for the
