DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 402 would standardize and simplify the license structure by having only two categories of discounted licenses. For the price of a yearly conservation license, persons age 65 and over, youth to age 14 and the disabled can fish and hunt birds. The second category would have persons age 65 and older and youth age 14 and under eligible for half-price deer and elk licenses.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) 25% of all resident hunters are bird hunters.
- 2) Revenues generated by the sale of conservation licenses to youth for fishing offset revenues lost from free bird hunting.
- 3) Revenues generated by the sale of conservation licenses to disabled for fishing offsets revenues lost from free bird hunting.
- 4) The present fee structure was used in the revenue calculations.
- 5) Effective date will be March 1, 1984.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approximately \$41,000 in FY85 would be generated from license sales to individuals ages 62, 63, and 64 who fish and hunt birds.

Approximately \$29,000 in FY85 would be generated from license sales to youth between the ages of 12 and 14 who hunt deer and elk.

TECHNICAL NOTE:

There is no effective date on the bill.

The department will request an effective date of March 1, 1984 which is the beginning of a license year.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 402, amended, changes the qualifying age for resident senior citizen deer and elk tags from 65 to 62 years of age or older. The amendment also proposes to change the qualifying age for resident senior citizen fish and game bird license exceptions from 65 to 62 years of age, which agrees with the current law. The bill also proposes to allow youth to the age of 14 to hunt and fish only with a conservation license and to hunt deer and elk for half the adult license price.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) All hunters between the ages of 62 and 65 will buy deer licenses.
- 2) 35% of those hunters will purchase elk licenses.
- 3) Revenues generated by the sale of conservation licenses to youth for fishing offsets lost revenue from free bird hunting.
- 4) Revenues generated by the sale of conservation licenses to disabled persons for fishing offsets revenues lost from free bird hunting.
