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House BILL NO. 462

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO INCREASE THE  
SALARIES OF MEMBERS OF THE COAL BOARD FROM \$25 A DAY TO \$50  
A DAY; AMENDING SECTION 90-6-204, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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Section 1. Section 90-6-204, MCA, is amended to read:

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"90-6-204. Chairman, meetings, compensation, and  
facilities. (1) The board shall elect a chairman from among  
its members.

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(2) The board shall meet quarterly and may meet at  
other times as called by the chairman or a majority of the  
members.

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(3) Members are entitled to compensation as provided  
for in 2-15-124(7), except that each member who is not a  
full-time salaried officer or employee of this state or of a  
political subdivision of this state is entitled to be paid  
\$50 for each day in which he is actually and necessarily  
engaged in the performance of his duties.

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(4) The department of commerce will provide suitable  
office facilities and the necessary staff for the coal  
board."

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 462 would increase the salary of coal board members from \$25 to \$50 per day.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Compensation doubled, therefore, FY 84 and 85's budget request for board member compensation is doubled.
