4 statement of intent is required for this bill because it gives the highway patrol authority to allow by rule a safety device on vehicle to protrude beyond the 102-inch width limit set in 61-10-102. This authorization is necessary to conform with federal law that excludes from the 102-inch width limit safety-related appendages such as rear view nirrors, twin signal lamps, marker lamps, steps and handhalds for entry and egress, flexible fender extensions, mudflaps, splash and spray suppressant devices or designs. refrigeration units, or air compressors which the highway patrol may interpret as necessary for safe and efficient operation of comercial motor vehicles.

If the implement or vehicle has a width in excess of 12 feet, it shall be preceded by flagman escorts for the purpose of warning other highway users. This restriction does not apply to dual-wheel tractors under 15 feet overall width which are used in farming operations. The rear of the implenent of husbandry or vehicle used for hauling hay shall
properly display lights which meet the standard requirements of s1-9-219. However, if the highway passes through a hazardous area, the implements or vehicles must be preceded and followed by flagman escorts.
