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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-9-321, MCA, is amended to read:

funds for special education. (1) for the purpose of
establishing the maximum-budget-without-a-vote amount for
current year special education program for a school
district, the superintendent of public instruction will
determine the total estimated cost of the special education
program for the school district on the basis of a special
education program budget submitted by the district. The
budget will be prepared on forms provided by the
superintendent of public instruction and will set out for

- (a) the estimated allowable costs associated with operating the program where allowable costs are as defined in 20-7-431;
  - (b) the number of pupils expected to be enrolled in
