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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 87-2-102, MCA, is amended to read: \*87-2-102. Resident defined. In determining a resident for the purpose of issuing resident fishing, hunting, and trapping licenses, the following provisions shall apply:

- (1) Members of the armed forces of the United States or members of the armed forces of foreign governments attached to the armed forces of the United States who are assigned to duty in Montana and members-of-their-immediate families their dependents who reside in their Montana household with them, after a period of 30 days within Montana, upon presenting assignment orders emanating from the proper unit commander, shall be considered residents for the purpose of this chapter. The 30-day residence requirement is waived in time of war.
  - (2) Any person who has been a resident of the state of

Montana, as defined in 1-1-215, for a period of 6 months immediately prior to making application for said license shall be eligible to receive a resident hunting, fishing, or trapping license.
