# DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 585 decreases the instances in which an offender is designated as non-dangerous.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Offenses against persons make up 29.2% of prison admissions.
- 2) Non-dangerous designations are given to 80% of convictions of offenses against persons and with dangerous given 20%.
- 3) Average sentence length for offenses against persons:

Dangerous - 14.5 years.

Non-Dangerous - 13.9 years

## FISCAL IMPACT:

There will be no fiscal impact from this bill for the 1984-85 Biennium. Beginning in 1986, it would increase the prison population by 109 inmates and then compound this for 1987 and beyond.
