- (b) except as provided under [section 4(2)], the balance of the block grant funds after distribution under subsections (1) and (2)(a) must be divided among eligible human resource development councils as follows:
- (i) one-half based upon the population residing within the areas of human resource development councils; and
- (ii) one-half based upon the low-income population, as that population may be determined under the provisions of the block grant, residing within the areas of the human resource development councils.

 - (3) The plan must be submitted to the department for approval prior to distribution by the department of block grant funds allocated to the human resource development council. The department may disapprove a plan, in whole or

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 659 provides for state use and distribution of federal Community Services Block Grant Funds.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The proposal requires distribution of Community Services Block Grant funds to Human Resource Development Councils (HRDC's) which is consistent with current federal requirements. The proposal also limits the determination for what purpose the funds shall be expended to HRDC's and county governing bodies.

The proposal does not increase nor decrease revenue or expenditures. The only discernible fiscal impact is that which could result from the state being unable to determine the specific purpose for expenditure of funds.

THE DEPARTMENT 11 SHALL THEN ALLOCATE BLOCK GRANT FUNDS TO THE APPROPRIATE 12 HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL TO ADMINISTER ACCORDING 13 IO THE PLAN APPROVED FOR SUCH COUNTY BY THE DEPARTMENT.
 - (3) The plan must be submitted to the department for approval prior to distribution by the department of block grant funds allocated to the human resource development council. The department may disapprove a plan, in whole or in part, only if the plan conflicts with a federal law or regulation. A disapproved plan may be amended and resubmitted to the department.
