8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
9	Section 1. Section 87-5-102, MCA, is amended to read:
19	#87-5-102. Definitions. As used in this part, the
11	following definitions apply:
12	(1) "Council" means the Montana nongame wildlife
13	advisory council provided for in [section 2].
14	<pre>+1+121 "Ecosystem" means a system of living organisms</pre>
15	and their environment, each influencing the existence of the
16	other and both necessary for the maintenance of life.
17	<del>(2)[3] "Endangered species" means any species or</del>
18	subspecies of wildlife actively threatened with extinction
19	due to any of the following factors:
20	(a) the destruction, drastic modification, or severe
21	curtailment of its habitat;
22	(b) its overutilization for scientific, commercial, or
23	sporting purposes;
24	(c) the effect on it of disease, pollution, or

- (d) other natural or man-made factors affecting its prospects of survival or recruitment within the state; or
  - (e) any combination of the foregoing factors.
- †31(4) "Management" means the collection and application of biological information for the purposes of increasing the number of individuals within species and populations of wildlife up to the optimum carrying capacity of their habitat and maintaining such levels. The term includes the entire range of activities that constitute a modern scientific resource program including but not limited to research, census, law enforcement, habitat acquisition and improvement, and education. Also included within the term, when and where appropriate, is the periodic or total protection of species or populations as well as regulated taking.
- this state as predatory in nature are not classified as nongame wildlife for purposes of this part.
- t57(6) "Optimum carrying capacity" means that point at which a given habitat can support healthy populations of wildlife species, having regard to the total ecosystem, without diminishing the ability of the habitat to continue

- 10 <u>NEW\_SECTION</u> Section 2. Montana nongame wildlife 11 advisory council. (1) There is a Montana nongame wildlife 12 advisory council.
- 13 (2) The council consists of six members appointed by
  14 the governor.
  - (3) The members appointed must be chosen as follows:
  - (a) two members representing agricultural interests;
- 17 (b) two members representing wildlife conservation
  18 interests;
  - (c) one professional wildlife biologist; and
  - (d) one member representing industrial interests.
  - (4) Council members shall serve 2-year terms.
- 22 (5) The council is allocated to the department of 23 fish, wildlife, and parks for administrative purposes only.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 661 establishes a six member nongame advisory council and provides compensation and per diem be paid to each member.

# ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Assume only two meetings per year.
- 2) Assume each meeting lasts one day.
- 3) Compensation for each member is \$25 per day.
- 4) Assume average round trip mileage is 400 miles reimbursed at 20¢ per mile.

  (Average based on total distances from Helena to each of the seven FWP regional headquarters as we do not know from which areas members will be appointed.)
- 5) Assume per diem will be \$37.50 per day.
- 6) Assume effective date will be 7/1/83.
