Every elected official, appointed 14 members of boards, commissions, councils, department 15 directors, and all other state employees shall be reimbursed 16 for meals and lodging while away from the person's designated headquarters and engaged in official state 17 18 business in accordance with the following provisions:

Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 668 increases the amount authorized for travel expenses and meal reimbursement for persons in state services.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) The average lodging reimbursement in-state in FY 82 was \$23/night. This rate will increase to \$26/night in FY 84 and \$27/night in FY 85.
- 2) It is estimated that 30% of the 1982 out-of-state lodging costs were for other than high cost cities. Therefore, the increases from a \$50 rate to \$55 for FY 84 and to \$60 for FY 85 were applied to only the 30% portion.
- 3) Adjustments to actual costs for in-state meals and lodging and out-of-state meals and lodging were made from other non-specific expense categories, i.e., in-state and out-of-state "other", "away-from-home allowance" and "general" as applicable.

COMMENTS:

It is important to note that the above fiscal impact is presented without regard to potential travel cut backs and therefore represents maximum potential impact.

It should also be noted that Montana's local governments (county, city, and school district) generally tend to follow the state rates even though they are not required by law to do so.
