1 INTRODUCED BY 2 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO HELP THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN BUTTE-SILVER BOW AND DEER LODGE COUNTIES COPE 5 WITH DECLINING ENROLLMENT AND LOSS OF TAX REVENUE AS A 6 RESULT OF INDUSTRY CLOSURES; TO ALLOW THE DISTRICTS TO USE 7 THEIR 1983-1984 AVERAGE NUMBER BELONGING COUNT FOR THE TWO В SUCCEEDING SCHOOL YEARS; AND PROVIDING A TERMINATION DATE. 9 10 WHEREAS, the loss of employment as a result of the 11 suspension of Anaconda Company mining operations in Butter 12 scheduled for June 1983, will undoubtedly lead to a 13 reduction in the number of school-age children in the Butte 14 and Anaconda area over the next few years; and 15 WHEREAS, the school districts in those communities will 16 lose over \$5 million in taxation revenue over the next 3 17 years, making it difficult to support the local school 18 systems beyond established state school aid; and 19 WHEREAS, the decline in enrollment that will occur 20 gradually over the next 3 or more years is hard to predict. 21 making it difficult to match reductions in teaching staff. 22 classroom units, and other school services with the 23

Average number belonging count for school 13 districts in certain counties. (1) The school districts in 14 the counties of Butte-Silver Bow and Deer Lodge may use as 15 the ANB count for the 1984-1985 and 1985-1986 school fiscal 16 years the average number belonging (ANB) count calculated

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(2) The school districts named in subsection (1) shall use the actual ANB count as calculated under 20-9-311 for the 1985-1986 school fiscal year for determining the maximum general fund schedule amounts for the 1986-1987 school fiscal year.

# DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 683 is an act to help the school districts in Butte-Silver Bow and Deer Lodge counties to cope with declining enrollments and loss of tax revenue; and allows the school districts to use the 1983-84 ANB for the two succeeding school years.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) The ANB will continue to drop at the present rate.
- 2) The Foundation Program will remain the same.
- 3) County Equalization will remain the same.
- 4) The districts' tax base will remain the same for both years of the biennium.
