4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION
5 82-15-105, MCA, TO INCREASE LICENSE FEES FOR PETROLEUM
6 MEASURING DEVICES."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
9 Section 1. Section 82-15-105, MCA, is amended to read:
10 "82-15-105. Licenses and fees. (1) A petroleum dealer
11 or liquefied petroleum dealer may not do business in this
12 state until a license has been issued to him by the
13 department. The license shall be obtained by the dealer by
14 making application to the department upon blank forms
15 provided by the department. A dealer who has not been issued
16 a license and who is found selling, offering for sale,
17 delivering, or distributing petroleum products shall upon
18 conviction be punished as provided by this part.
19 (2) The fee for this license shall be determined as
20 follows and depends upon the number of devices utilized by
21 the dealer:
22 (a) each gasoline pump, diesel pump, or fuel oil pump
23 measuring device--~~\$3~~ \$2;
24 (b) each petroleum vehicle tank meter or bulk
25 petroleum meter of 2 inches (5.08 centimeters) and

1 under--~~\$10~~ \$15;
2 (c) each bulk petroleum meter over 2 inches (5.08
3 centimeters)--~~\$15~~ \$20;
4 (d) each liquefied petroleum liquid meter--~~\$15~~ \$25;
5 (e) each vapor meter--\$3;
6 (f) each petroleum and liquefied petroleum vehicle
7 tank up to and including 2,000 gallons (7,570 liters)--\$20;
8 (g) each petroleum and liquefied petroleum vehicle
9 tank over 2,000 gallons (7,570 liters)--\$20 plus \$4 for each
10 additional 1,000 gallons (3,785 liters).
11 (3) All licenses are annual and nontransferable as to
12 person or location and expire on December 31 of each year.
13 There is an additional charge of 50% on all license fees
14 that are not paid before March 1 of each year in which the
15 vehicle tank, meter, or measuring device is in use. If the
16 fee is not paid, the equipment shall be sealed and removed
17 from service by the department. It is unlawful for anyone to
18 use a device so removed from service or to break the seal
19 until all fees have been paid."

ASSUMPTIONS:


- 1) Assumptions used in obtaining estimates were based on the number of devices tested in the fiscal year 1982.
