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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Class B-12--nonresident elk 14 license. A person not a resident, as defined in 87-2-102, 15 who will be 12 years of age or older prior to September 15 16 of the season for which the license is issued and who is the 17 holder of a nonresident conservation license may, upon 18 payment of the fee of \$250 and subject to the limitations 19 prescribed by law and department regulation, apply to the 20 fish and game office, Helena, Montana, to purchase a B-12 21 nonresident elk license that entitles the holder to pursue, 22 hunt, shoot, and kill elk and possess the carcass thereof. 23 No more than 17,000 Class B-12 licenses may be sold in any 24 one license vear. 25

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 719 eliminates the nonresident big game combination license; provides for nonresident elk license; removes area restrictions on nonresident deer licenses; and limits the number of nonresident elk and deer licenses sold.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

It is impossible to determine the fiscal impact of this bill. We currently sell 17,000 big game licenses at \$275 for a total income of \$4,675,000. This represents 43% of our total license revenue. It is impossible to estimate the licenses that the nonresident would purchase if they were not part of a combination license. Several other conditions that could effect license sales are the national economy and fee changes in other states with similar licenses.
