5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT THE
6 TRAINING SERVICES OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY TRAINING
7 COORDINATOR MAY BE MADE AVAILABLE TO CITY ATTORNEYS AND THAT
8 THE TRAINING COORDINATOR MAY CHARGE A FEE FOR THE TRAINING;
9 AMENDING SECTION 44-4-103, MCA."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 Section 1. Section 44-4-103, MCA, is amended to read:

13 "44-4-103. Functions. The training coordinator shall
14 perform the functions assigned by the attorney general. The
15 functions may include but are not limited to the following:
16 (1) providing local training in current aspects of the
17 criminal law for county attorneys, city attorneys, and other
18 law enforcement personnel. The training coordinator may
19 require payment by city attorneys of a fee commensurate with
20 the cost of the training.

21 (2) assisting in developing and disseminating
22 standards, procedures, and policies which will insure that
23 criminal laws are applied consistently and uniformly
24 throughout Montana;

25 (3) consolidating present and past information on

1 important aspects of the criminal law and providing a pool
2 of official opinions, legal briefs, and other relevant
3 criminal law information;

4 (4) providing assistance with research, briefs, or
5 other technical services requested by a county attorney or
6 law enforcement official;

7 (5) applying for and disbursing federal funds
8 available to aid the prosecutorial function."
