# DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 752 requires the Department of Commerce to adopt energy efficiency standards for certain appliances and to prohibit the sale of appliances not meeting such standards.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Assume that minimum levels of operating efficiency standards have been developed by other organizations, little or no testing expense results from this bill.
- 2) Assuming that use of "a significant amount of energy" refers to "major applicances" used for personal or household purposes (dryers, refrigerators, TV's, etc.), standards for commercial usage would not be contemplated by this bill, thus limiting standards to approximately 12.
- 3) Assume initial rulemaking will take some staff and legal time.
- 4) Assume enforcement is passive (complaint basis) rather than active (field inspection and testing), enforcement can be absorbed by Consumer Unit with some support for supplies and travel.
