DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 772 would raise the on-schedule school bus reimbursement to a base rate of 72 cents per mile the first year and to 80 cents per mile the second year of the biennium. It would change the break point in bus size from 50 to 45 and reduce the increment from 2.5 cents to 2 cents.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Bus overall costs will remain the same for the next biennium.
- 2) Bus miles will remain the same for the next biennium.
- 3) Bus size will remain the same for the next biennium.

4) There will be no load requirement as under the present law.
