4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY  
5 FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1985;  
6 TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS;  
7 AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."  
8  
9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:  
10 Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act,  
11 unless otherwise stated, the following definitions apply:  
12 (1) "Agency" includes each state office, department,  
13 board, commission, council, committee, unit of the  
14 university system, or other entity or instrumentality of the  
15 executive branch, office of the legislative branch, or  
16 office of the judicial branch of state government.  
17 (2) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the  
18 budget director of a request submitted through the  
19 Architecture and Engineering Division of the Department of  
20 Administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a  
21 capital project within an agency in order to increase the  
22 appropriations of another capital project within that agency  
23 or to obtain financing to expand a project with funds which  
24 were not available for consideration by the Legislature.  
25 (3) "BPICA" means the bond proceeds and insurance

1 clearance account.  
2 (4) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or  
3 improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation,  
4 furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.  
5 (5) "Other appropriated funds" means money, other than  
6 general fund or BPICA money, that accrues under the  
7 provisions of law to an agency indicated in this act.  
8 Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No  
9 existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of  
10 the project as approved by the 48th Legislature unless the  
11 capital project expansion is authorized by an approved  
12 budget amendment.  
13 Section 3. Federal funds for administration. All  
14 federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of  
15 administering the federal funds when the cost was financed  
16 from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.  
17 Section 4. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding any other  
18 provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects  
19 previously appropriated are reappropriated until June 30,  
20 1985, for the purposes for which originally appropriated.  
21 Section 5. Capital projects appropriations. The  
22 following money is appropriated from the indicated accounts

Section 8. Planning and design. The Department of Administration may proceed with the planning and design of capital projects prior to the sale of bonds or the receipt of other appropriated funds. The Department may utilize interaccount loans in accordance with 17-2-107 to pay such planning and design costs incurred prior to the receipt of bond proceeds or other appropriated funds.

Section 9. Capital projects -- contingent funds. If any capital project is financed in whole or in part with appropriations contingent upon the receipt of other appropriated funds, the Department of Administration may not let such projects for bid until the agency has submitted a financial plan for approval by the director of the Department of Administration. No such financial plan may be approved by the director if:

- (1) the level of funding provided under the financial plan deviates substantially from the funding levels provided in this act for that project; or
- (2) the scope of the project must be substantially altered or revised from the preliminary plans presented for that project in the 1983-85 Long-range Building Program presented to the 48th Legislature.

Section 10. Legislative consent. The appropriations authorized in this act must be considered as legislative consent for the capital projects contained in this act within the meaning of 18-2-102.

Section 11. Severability. If a part of this act is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of this act is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are severable from the invalid applications.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 833

INTRODUCED BY MANUEL, BARDANOUVE

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY  
FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1985;  
TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS;  
AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act,  
unless otherwise stated, the following definitions apply:

(1) "Agency" includes each state office, department,  
board, commission, council, committee, unit of the  
university system, or other entity or instrumentality of the  
executive branch, office of the legislative branch, or  
office of the judicial branch of state government.

(2) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the  
budget director of a request submitted through the  
Architecture and Engineering Division of the Department of  
Administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a  
capital project within an agency in order to increase the  
appropriations of another capital project within that agency  
or to obtain financing to expand a project with funds which  
were not available for consideration by the Legislature.

(3) "BPICA" means the bond proceeds and insurance

clearance account.

(4) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or  
improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation,  
furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

(5) "Other appropriated funds" means money, other than  
general funds, UNIVERSITY AUXILIARY FUNDS, UNIVERSITY PLANT  
FUNDS GENERATED FROM AUXILIARY FUND OPERATIONS, OTHER LAWFUL  
PURPOSE FUNDS FROM BOND INDENTURES, STUDENT FEES, or BPICA  
money, that accrues under the provisions of law to an agency  
indicated in this act.

Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No  
existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of  
the project as approved by the 48th Legislature unless the  
capital project expansion is authorized by an approved  
budget amendment.

Section 3. Federal funds for administration. All  
federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of  
administering the federal funds when the cost was financed  
from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.

Section 4. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding (1) EXCEPT  
AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2) AND NOTWITHSTANDING any other  
provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects  
previously appropriated are reappropriated until June 30,  
1985, for the purposes for which originally appropriated.

(2) THE BOND PROCEEDS AND INSURANCE CLEARANCE FUND

1 APPROPRIATION AUTHORIZED BY THE 47TH LEGISLATURE FOR THE  
2 ACQUISITION AND DEVELOPMENT OF A CEMETERY AT THE OLD FORT  
3 CUSTER SITE IN BIG HORN COUNTY IS REAPPROPRIATED FOR ROAD  
4 IMPROVEMENTS AT THE CANYON FERRY STATE RECREATION AREA.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION FOR MANSEFIELD CENTER FOR PACIFIC AFFAIRS. THERE IS APPROPRIATED \$1 MILLION FROM THE BPICA TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO ASSIST IN THE ERECTION OF A MEMORIAL IN HONOR OF ONE OF MONTANA'S GREAT CITIZENS, MIKE MANSEFIELD. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE MAUREEN AND MIKE MANSEFIELD FOUNDATION PURSUANT TO WHICH THE DEPARTMENT SHALL AGREE TO PAY THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED BY THIS SECTION TO THE FOUNDATION UPON THE RECEIPT OF AT LEAST \$6 MILLION BY THE FOUNDATION FROM OTHER SOURCES. THE FUNDS APPROPRIATED BY THIS SECTION MUST BE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE MANSEFIELD CENTER FOR PACIFIC AFFAIRS AT POLSON, MONTANA. BY THIS APPROPRIATION, THE 48TH LEGISLATURE INDICATES THAT IT HAS DETERMINED THAT THE STATE'S SUPPORT OF THE ERECTION OF A MEMORIAL THROUGH THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE MANSEFIELD CENTER FOR PACIFIC AFFAIRS AT POLSON IS A LAWFUL PUBLIC PURPOSE OF STATEWIDE IMPORTANCE IN THAT IT WILL SERVE TO INSPIRE SENTIMENTS OF RESPECT FOR A MAN OF GREAT STATURE AND IMPORTANCE TO THE STATE, WILL GENERATE IMPORTANT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OF THE STATE BY DIRECT EMPLOYMENT, ATTRACTION OF VISITORS, AND ESTABLISHMENT OF EXPANDED TRADE OPPORTUNITIES.

 9 HOUSE BILL 5, ENACTED BY THE 47TH LEGISLATURE, SECOND

15 Section 10. Planning and design. The Department of

22 Section 11. Capital projects -- contingent funds. If

1 let such projects for bid until the agency has submitted a  
2 financial plan for approval by the director of the

12 Section 12. Legislative consent. The appropriations

16 Section 13. Severability. If a part of this act is  
17 invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid  
18 part remain in effect. If a part of this act is invalid in  
19 one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect  
20 in all valid applications that are severable from the  
21 invalid applications.

22 Section 14. Effective date. This act is effective on  
23 passage and approval.

## HOUSE BILL NO. 833

INTRODUCED BY MANUEL, BARDANOUVE

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE BIENNIUM ENDING JUNE 30, 1985; TO PROVIDE FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING TO THE APPROPRIATIONS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Definitions. For the purposes of this act, unless otherwise stated, the following definitions apply:

(1) "Agency" includes each state office, department, board, commission, council, committee, unit of the university system, or other entity or instrumentality of the executive branch, office of the legislative branch, or office of the judicial branch of state government.

(2) "Approved budget amendment" means approval by the budget director of a request submitted through the Architecture and Engineering Division of the Department of Administration to transfer excess funds appropriated to a capital project within an agency in order to increase the appropriations of another capital project within that agency or to obtain financing to expand a project with funds which were not available for consideration by the Legislature.

(3) "BPICA" means the bond proceeds and insurance

clearance account.

(4) "Capital project" means acquisition of land or improvements, planning, capital construction, renovation, furnishing, or major repair projects authorized in this act.

(5) "Other appropriated funds" means money, other than general funds, UNIVERSITY AUXILIARY FUNDS, UNIVERSITY PLANT FUNDS GENERATED FROM AUXILIARY FUND OPERATIONS, OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSE FUNDS FROM BOND INDENTURES, STUDENT FEES, or BPICA money, that accrues under the provisions of law to an agency indicated in this act.

Section 2. Expansion required to be authorized. No existing capital project may be expanded beyond the scope of the project as approved by the 48th Legislature unless the capital project expansion is authorized by an approved budget amendment.

Section 3. Federal funds for administration. All federal funds received as a reimbursement for the cost of administering the federal funds when the cost was financed from the general fund shall revert to the general fund.

Section 4. Reappropriation. Notwithstanding (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2) AND NOTWITHSTANDING any other provision of law, the remaining balances on capital projects previously appropriated are reappropriated until June 30, 1985, for the purposes for which originally appropriated.

SECTION 7. APPROPRIATION FOR MANSEFIELD CENTER FOR		
PACIFIC AFFAIRS. THERE IS APPROPRIATED \$1 MILLION FROM THE		

BPICA TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE TO ASSIST IN THE  
ERECTION OF A MEMORIAL IN HONOR OF ONE OF MONTANA'S GREAT  
CITIZENS, MIKE MANSEFIELD. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ENTER INTO AN  
AGREEMENT WITH THE MAUREEN AND MIKE MANSEFIELD FOUNDATION  
PURSUANT TO WHICH THE DEPARTMENT SHALL AGREE TO PAY THE  
FUNDS APPROPRIATED BY THIS SECTION TO THE FOUNDATION UPON  
THE RECEIPT OF AT LEAST \$6 MILLION BY THE FOUNDATION FROM

 8 SPECIAL SESSION, ARE REAPPROPRIATED THROUGH THE BIENNIAL  
 9 ENDING JUNE 30, 1985, THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION MAY  
 10 EXEMPT THESE PROJECTS FROM ANY PROVISIONS OF MONTANA LAW

13 Section 10. Planning and design. The Department of  
 14 Administration may proceed with the planning and design of  
 15 capital projects prior to the sale of bonds or the receipt  
 16 of other appropriated funds. The Department may utilize  
 17 interaccount loans in accordance with 17-2-107 to pay such  
 18 planning and design costs incurred prior to the receipt of  
 19 bond proceeds or other appropriated funds.

20 Section 11. Capital projects -- contingent funds. If  
 21 any capital project is financed in whole or in part with  
 22 appropriations contingent upon the receipt of other  
 23 appropriated funds, the Department of Administration may not  
 24 let such projects for bid until the agency has submitted a  
 25 financial plan for approval by the director of the

1 Department of Administration. No such financial plan may be  
2 approved by the director if:

3 (1) the level of funding provided under the financial  
4 plan deviates substantially from the funding levels provided  
5 in this act for that project; or

6 (2) the scope of the project must be substantially  
7 altered or revised from the preliminary plans presented for  
8 that project in the 1983-85 Long-range Building Program  
9 presented to the 48th Legislature.

10 Section 12. Legislative consent. The appropriations  
11 authorized in this act must be considered as legislative  
12 consent for the capital projects contained in this act  
13 within the meaning of 18-2-102.

14 Section 13. Severability. If a part of this act is  
15 invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid  
16 part remain in effect. If a part of this act is invalid in  
17 one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect  
18 in all valid applications that are severable from the  
19 invalid applications.

20 Section 14. Effective date. This act is effective on  
21 passage and approval.
