### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 863 provides for the abolishment of the state administered and locally administered fire fighter and police officer retirement systems. It permits replacement of this coverage for all fire fighters and police officers through new locally administered fully funded systems or participation in the PERS.

#### ASSUMPTIONS:

1) Basis for all assumptions in state administered systems 1982 actuarial calculations.

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2) 10 Fire Fighers and 10 Police Officers will be replaced during the biennium.

3) All cities will elect to join PERS and not form a new retirement system.
