House Bill 873 creates within the Governor's Office an office of aging.


ASSUMPTIONS:

- 2) A coordinator would be a grade 16 with 18% benefits.
- 3) Part time clerical assistance would be needed at a grade 8 and 18% benefits.
- 4) Assume 4% increase per year.

House Bill 873, amended, creates within the Governor's Office an office of aging.


ASSUMPTIONS:
