13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

14 Section 1. Appropriation. All revenues received under
15 the provisions of 20-9-343 for state equalization aid are
16 appropriated to the Superintendent of Public Instruction for
17 the biennium ending June 30, 1985, for public school support
18 other than for special education. This appropriation
19 includes the balance of the contingency appropriation in
20 House Bill No. 611, Laws of 1981, from the general fund for
21 the biennium ending June 30, 1983, that remains in the state
22 equalization aid earmarked revenue account at the end of the
23 current biennium.

24 Section 2. General fund appropriation. There is
25 appropriated from the general fund \$24,737,000 for the

1 biennium ending June 30, 1985, to be used to the extent
2 funds appropriated in section 1 are insufficient to finance
3 the maximum budget schedules for public schools excluding
4 special education.

5 Section 3. Report on cost-effective use of maximum
6 budget schedule funding. The Board of Public Education
7 jointly with the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall
8 report to the 49th Legislature on how the funds guaranteed
9 under the maximum budget schedules provided in 20-9-316
10 through 20-9-319 can be used in the most cost-effective
11 manner to provide quality education within the accreditation
12 standards set by the Board under the provisions of 20-7-102.
13 The report must include:

14 (1) an evaluation of the effectiveness of various
15 alternatives in educational programs used by schools or
16 districts in compliance with the accreditation standards;

17 (2) descriptions of those school programs that can
18 serve as model programs; and

19 (3) budgets that demonstrate the relationship between
