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13	WHEREAS, the Public Service Commission, in an effort to
14	assure the lowest possible cost for the minimum amount of
15	residential electric service required for subsistence of
16	Montana citizens, created a classification resulting in an

1 increases and who have no alternative to electric heat through Montana's long and frigid winters and whose electrically heated homes were constructed when electricity 3 rates were much lower; and

WHEREAS, "lifeline rates" do not satisfy essential needs for home use where natural gas is not available; and WHEREAS, section 69-3-306, MCA, authorizes the Public Service Commission to prescribe classifications of service to which each public utility is required to conform its schedule of rates.

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12 NON. THEREFORE. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE

13 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

14 That the Public Service Commission Immediately 15 prescribe a classification embracing electrically heated residences and essential home usage in areas where consumers 16 17 lack the alternative of natural gas heating.

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that electricity rates for 19 residences in areas subject to the new classification be 20 designed to allow immediate and substantial reduction of 21 charges to customers using electricity for residential space 22 heating and essential home usage.
