 - (3) Not more than three members may at the time of appointment or thereafter during their respective terms be members of the same political party.
 - (4) No elective state official or state officer during the term of office to which he was elected or appointed and no state employee may be a member of the commission.
- 18 (5) No resolution, motion, or other decision of the
 19 commission may be adopted or passed without the favorable
 20 vote of at least three members.
- (6) The commission is allocated to the department for
 administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121.
 - (7) The commission is designated as a quasi-judicial board for purposes of 2-15-124; however, the provision of 2-15-124(1) that at least one member of a quasi-judicial
