NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: (1) That the President of the United States is strongly urged to propose to the Soviet Union and other nations: (a) a mutual freeze on the development, testing, production, and deployment of nuclear weapons and of missiles, watercraft, and aircraft designed primarily to deliver nuclear weapons: (a) verification safequards for the freeze that are satisfactory to all parties; and (c) eventual nuclear disarmament by all nations.

(2) That if such a freeze is mutually agreed upon and the Soviet Union has conclusively proved that it has frozen
