4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF TISTON
5	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA URGING THE
6	DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS TO EFFECTIVELY
7	CONTROL THE NOXIOUS WEEDS ON STATE-OWNED LAND IN LAKE
8	COUNTY; URGING THE DEPARTMENT TO INSTITUTE A RENTAL OR
9	SHARECROP SYSTEM OF MANAGEMENT: AND SUGGESTING THAT SUCH
10	LANDS BE OFFERED FOR SALE IF THE WEED PROBLEM IS NOT
11	CONTROLLED BY JANUARY 1, 1985.

13	WHEREAS, since 1950, the Department of Fish, Wildlife,
14	and Parks has owned approximately 3,500 acres surrounding
15	the Ninepipe Reservoir in Lake County; and
16	WHEREAS, this land, when first acquired by the
17	Department, was managed through a system of comprehensive
18	sharecropping; and
19	WHEREAS, this system of management was very successful
20	from the viewpoint of Lake County residents and the
21	Department; and
22	WHEREAS, in the mid-1960s, the Department changed its
23	system of management by positioning a salaried manager,
24	state equipment, and other facilities on the land in an
25	attount to sutopomously manage the land; and

WHEREAS, noxious weeds on the land were controlled 1 prior to the Department's assuming full responsibility for 2 3 managing the land; and WHEREAS, the Department itself admits that during the 5 past 15 years weed problems have developed, such as coverage of the land with Canada thistle and whitetop, extensive 6 7 destruction of a previously dense nesting cover, and disappearance of game; and 8 9 WHEREAS, noxious weed problems on such state-owned lands are of disastrous proportions, rendering these lands 10 useless for game management and agricultural production; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the uncontrolled noxious weed problems on these lands pose a serious threat to neighboring private 13 agricultural lands and to the economic security of the 14 owners thereof: and 15 WHEREAS, the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, 16 17 by its own admission, is at a loss to know what to do to 18 effectively manage the noxious weed problems. 19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 20 21 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: (1) That the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks 22 23 immediately commence a system of effective noxious weed

control on all state-owned lands in Lake County under the

(2) That private farm operators be given the opportunity to assume responsibility for the management and husbandry of such lands on a rental or sharecrop basis.
