2 INTRODUCED BY KOLSTAD, CURTISS
3 BY REQUEST OF THE JOINT SUBCOMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY
4
5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AMENDING 7-4-2203, MCA,
6 TO PROVIDE FOR THE NONPARTISAN ELECTION OF COUNTY ATTORNEYS
7 AND SHERIFFS."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
10 Section 1. Section 7-4-2203, MCA, is amended to read:
11 "7-4-2203. County officers. (1) There may be elected
12 or appointed the following county officers, who shall
13 possess the qualifications for suffrage prescribed by the
14 Montana constitution and such other qualifications as may be
15 prescribed by law:
16 (a) one county attorney;
17 (b) one clerk of the district court;
18 (c) one county clerk;
19 (d) one sheriff;
20 (e) one treasurer;
21 (f) one auditor if authorized by 7-6-2401;
22 (g) one county superintendent of schools;
23 (h) one county surveyor;
24 (i) one assessor;
25 (j) one coroner;

1 (k) one public administrator; and
2 (1) at least one justice of the peace.
3 (2) The commissioners may appoint at their discretion
4 constables. Not more than one constable may be appointed
5 for each justice's court.
6 (3) All elective township officers may be elected at
7 each general election as now provided by law.
8 ~~(4) Each elective county attorney and sheriff shall be~~
9 ~~nominated and elected on a nonpartisan ballot by the~~
10 ~~qualified voters of the county according to the provisions~~
11 ~~of Title 13, chapter 14, part 1."~~

1 Senate JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2
2 INTRODUCED BY Mohr

4 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
5 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA DIRECTING THE
6 DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION TO APPOINT A MEMBER OF THE
7 HOMEBUILDING INDUSTRY TO THE MONTANA BUILDING CODE ADVISORY
8 COUNCIL.

10 WHEREAS, the 43rd Legislature, through Senate
11 Resolution No. 34, created the Montana Building Code
12 Advisory Council, consisting of 11 members representing a
13 cross section of the construction industry; and

14 WHEREAS, no member was listed to represent the
15 conventional homebuilding industry on the Advisory Council;
16 and

17 WHEREAS, conventionally built homes represent a very
18 large part of the construction industry; and

19 WHEREAS, the building codes directly affect the
20 conventional homebuilding industry and indirectly affect the
21 people it serves.

23 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
24 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

25 That, in addition to the members currently appointed

1 to serve on the Montana Building Code Advisory Council, the
2 Department of Administration shall appoint a member from the
3 conventional homebuilding industry, who shall have equal
4 status with the other members and who shall serve at the
5 pleasure of the Department.
