14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
15	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Transmittal of veto messages
16	to legislative council. The governor shall transmit one copy
17	of each veto message to the legislative council.
18	Section 2. Section 5-11-203, MCA, is amended to read:
19	#5-11-203. Distribution of senate and house journals
20	and session laws. (1) Immediately after the senate and house
21	journals and the session laws are bound, the legislative
22	council shall distribute them.
23	(2) The council shall distribute the house and senate
24	journals as follows:

(a) to each county clerk, one copy of each for the use

•	or the country;
2	(b) to the Montana state library, 20 copies of each
3	for the use of the library and distribution to depositor
4	libraries, of which 2 copies will be deposited with the
5	state historical library for security purposes;
6	(c) to the state law librarian, two copies of each for
7	the use of the library and such additional copies as may be
8	necessary for the purposes of exchange;
9	(d) to the library of congress and each public office
10	as defined in 2-2-102, two copies of each; and
11	(e) to each member of the legislature, the secretary
12	of the senate, and the chief clerk of the house of
13	representatives from the session at which the journals were
14	adopted, one copy of each.
15	(3) The council shall distribute the session laws as
16	follows:

18	branch of the United States, one copy each: to any agency
