SENATE BILL NO. 47

INTRODUCED BY JACOBSON

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CHANGING THE QUALIFYING AGE FOR RESIDENT SENIOR CITIZEN DEER AND ELK TAGS FROM 65 TO 62 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER; AMENDING SECTION 87-2-801, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 87-2-801, MCA, is amended to read:

"87-2-801. Residents over sixty-two years of age. (1)

A resident, under the definition of 87-2-102, who is 62 years or older shall be entitled to fish and hunt game birds with a conservation license issued by the department. The form of such license shall be prescribed by the department.

(2) A resident who is 65 62 years of age or older is also entitled to purchase regular resident deer and elk tags at a price that is no more than one-half of the fee paid by a resident who is 15 years old or older and who is under 65 62 years of age."

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. This act is effective May 1, 1983.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act changing the qualifying age for resident senior citizen deer and elk tags from 65 to 62 years of age.

ASSUMPTIONS:

All hunters ages 62, 63 and 64 will buy deer licenses. Thirty-five percent of those hunters will buy elk licenses.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Total revenue from deer and elk licenses purchased by hunters ages 62, 63 and 64:


