 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:  
 12 Section 1. State auditor, superintendent of public  
 13 instruction, and secretary of state -- powers as department  
 14 heads. The state auditor, superintendent of public  
 15 instruction, and secretary of state have, in addition to any  
 16 other power vested by the Montana constitution or by law,  
 17 the same powers accorded the heads of departments by Title  
 18 2, chapter 15, part 1. No duties relating to the governor  
 19 or requirements for permission from or approval by the  
 20 governor in Title 2, chapter 15, part 1, apply to such  
 21 elected officials in the exercise of such power unless  
 22 specifically required in Title 2, chapter 15, part 1.
