Senate Bill 82 for $\qquad$ pursuant to ' Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 82 authorizes special license plates for veterans with 100 percent service-connected disabilities and for former prisoners-of-war; exempts vehicles bearing those special plates from parking fees; provides for retention of the special plates; provides for replacement of lost plates; and provides a delayed effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1) It is assumed plates can be manufactured under existing process with an additional cost of $\$ 2$ per plate and $\$ 3$ for handling.
2) Assume 604 eligible disabled veterans and 300 eligible former prisoners-of-war.
