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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE MOTOR VEHICLE DIVISION TO PRESCRIBE THE FORM OF THE 20-DAY PROOF OF PURCHASE WHICH MAY BE DISPLAYED ON TRANSFERRED MOTOR VEHICLES; AUTHORIZING COUNTY TREASURERS TO COLLECT A FEE FOR ISSUING THE PROOF OF PURCHASE; ALLOWING ONLY ONE PROOF OF PURCHASE PER TRANSFER OF TITLE; AMENDING SECTION 61-3-317+ MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-3-317, MCA, is amended to read:

"61-3-317. New registration required for transferred
vehicle — grace period — penalty — display of proof of
purchase. Except as otherwise provided herein, the new owner
of a transferred motor vehicle shall have a grace period of
20 calendar days from the date of purchase to make
application and pay the taxes, or fees, or both provided by
part 5 of this chapter, unless the tax or fee has been paid
for the year, as if the vehicle were being registered for
the first time in that registration year. If the motor
vehicle was not purchased from a duly licensed motor vehicle
dealer as provided in this chapter, it is not a violation of
this chapter or any other law for the purchaser to operate

the vehicle upon the streets and highways of this state without a certificate of registration during the 20-day 2 period, provided that at all times during that period a bill 3 of--sale--or--other proof of purchase <u>issued by the county</u> 5 treasurer or a law enforcement officer authorized by the division is displayed on the vehicle. The cost of the proof 7 of nurchase is \$20 one half of which shall be distributed to the county general fund and one-half to the state general fund. The proof of purchase sust be in a form prescribed by 10 the division reciting the date of purchase is and must be 11 clearly displayed in the rear window of the motor vehicle. 12 Registration and license fees collected under 61-3-321 are 13 not required to be paid when a license plate is transferred 14 under this section and 61-3-335. Failure to make application 15 within the time provided herein subjects the purchaser to a penalty of \$10. The penalty shall be collected by the county 16 17 treasurer at the time of registration and shall be in 18 addition to the fees otherwise provided by law. The county 19 treasurer shall keep a record of all proofs of purchase 20 issued. Doly one proof of purchase may be issued for each 21 transfer of title."

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 131 authorizes the Motor Vehicle Division to prescribe the form of the 20-day proof-of-purchase which may be displayed on transferred motor vehicles and authorizes county treasurers to collect a fee for issuing the proof-of-purchase.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Approximately 50 percent of title transfers are between individuals rather than dealers.
- 2) Fiscal note assumes a maximum of 75,000 will obtain proof-of-purchase.
- 3) Motor Vehicle Division will provide proof-of-purchase forms.

County Treasurers will realize additional workload recording all proofs-of-purchase issued as well as accounting for fees collected. The counties will receive one-half of the \$2.00 charge, bringing an estimated \$75,000 for the biennium in increased revenues to the counties.
