In compliance with a written request received <u>January 13</u>, <u>19</u><u>83</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>Senate Bill 132</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 132 reestablishes the Montana Outfitters' Council; provides a procedure for filling council vacancies; provides for council member compensation and expenses, authorizes the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks to prescribe written contract forms; and establishes fees commensurate with costs.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

1) The council will hold seven meetings per year.

- 2) Compensation for each of the seven members is \$25 per day.
- 3) Mileage is reimbursed at \$.20 per mile and lodging and meals at a maximum of \$37.50 per day.
