A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CHANGING THE DEFINITION OF "PRIORITY PRIMARY ROUTE" AND GIVING PREFERENCE FOR THAT DESIGNATION TO HIGHWAYS IN COUNTIES OF MORE THAN 75,000 POPULATION; AMENDING SECTIONS 60-3-221 AND 60-3-222, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 60-3-221, MCA, is amended to read:

"60-3-221. Priority primary routes defined. For the
purposes of 60-3-221 through 60-3-225, "priority primary
routes" are defined as those high-traffic sections of
nighways on the federal-aid primary system or other sections
of federal-aid highways that terminate at parallel or
intersecting federal-aid primary highways to complete
connecting links with which connect—to the interstate
system."

Section 2. Section 60-3-222. MCA, is amended to read:

#60-3-222. Selection of routes. Such routes shall be
selected by the department in consultation with appropriate
local officials, subject to the approval of the secretary of
transportation, for priority of improvement to supplement
the service provided by the interstate system by furnishing
needed, adequate traffic collection and distribution

- facilities. Preference must be given to a highway situated
- 2 in a county of more than 75,000 population, according to the
- 3 latest federal decennial census.*
