Section 1. Section 20-7-102, MCA, is amended to read:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

"20-7-102. Accreditation of schools. (1) Every school year the conditions under which each elementary school, middle school, junior high school, and high school operates shall be reviewed by the superintendent of public instruction to determine each school's compliance with the standards of accreditation. The accreditation status of every school shall then be established by the board of public education upon the recommendation of the superintendent of public instruction, and notification of such status for the applicable school year shall be given to each district.

(2) A nonpublic high school mays through its governing body, request that the board of public education accredit the school. Nonpublic high schools may be accredited in the
