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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE LAWS RELATING TO TRANSFER OF STATE CONTRACTS; AMENDING SECTION 18-4-105. MCA."

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24 25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 18-4-105, MCA, is amended to read:
#18-4-105. Contract transfers and collusion prohibited
-- violations and penalty. (1) No contract or order or any
interest therein may be transferred. assigned. or
subcontracted by the party to whom the contract or order is
given to any other party without the express written
approval of the state, and the state may declare void any
such unapproved transfer. assignment. or subcontract. No
approval of a transfer. assignment. or subcontract may
release the original obligor from his obligations to the
state under the contract or order.

(2) Collusion or secret agreements between bidders for the purpose of securing any advantage to the bidders as against the state in the awarding of contracts is prohibited. The state may declare the contract void if the department finds sufficient evidence after a contract has

been let that the contract was obtained by a bidder or bidders by reason of collusive or secret agreement among the bidders to the disadvantage of the state.

(3) All rights of action for a breach of a contract by the contracting parties are reserved to the state.

6 (4) A person who violates the provisions of 2-2-201 or this section, or both, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not less than \$500 or more than \$5,000, and the state of Montana may at its option declare any contract in violation of the provisions of 2-2-201 or this section or both void ab initio.
