DESCRIPTION OF THE PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 205 extends the "Employee Incentive Program" for two more years.

ASSUMPTION:

- 1) 0.35 general fund FTE is assigned to the program and absorbed.
- 2) Agency personal service costs are widely dispersed, absorbed and undetermined.
- 3) In each fiscal year, there will be at least one successful suggestion resulting in a first year cost-savings of at least \$25,000.
- 4) Promotional and printing costs will equal \$700 in each of the next two fiscal years.
