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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE DIVISION TO USE A PORTION OF CONTRIBUTIONS FROM EMPLOYERS FOR CERTAIN ADMINISTRATIVE PURPOSES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

SE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Contributions for certain administrative purposes. Beginning with the third quarter of 1983, .2% of employer contributions received by the department and .1% of total wages paid by employers not covered by an experience rating may be used by the department for administrative purposes. All such contributions must be deposited in the unemployment insurance administration account provided for in 39-51-406 and used as appropriated by the legislature. Any contributions deposited to the unemployment insurance administration account that are not appropriated by the legislature must be transferred to the unemployment trust fund account provided for in 39-51-402.

Section 2. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 39, chapter 51, and the provisions of Title 39, chapter 51,

Section 3. Effective date. This act is effective

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 210 authorizes the Unemployment Insurance Division to use .2% of experience-rated employer contributions and .1% of total wages paid by employers not covered by experience rating, for purposes of funding Job Service Offices.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Three quarters of collection activity in FY84 (collections to be made beginning 10/83 for contributions on July September 83 wages) and 4 quarters in FY85.
- 2) Taxable wages for experience rated employers projected at \$1.826B in FY84 and \$1.9B in FY85.
- 3) Total wages for other (non-experienced rated) employers is projected at \$670.28M in FY84 and \$1,013.36M in FY85.
- 4) Assume maximum expenditures to be used for administrative purposes and balance to revert to trust fund for benfits.
