A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROVIDE A 1-WEEK WAITING PERIOD BETWEEN UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION BENEFIT YEARS WHEN THE CLAIMANT IS IN A COMPENSABLE STATUS AT THE END OF HIS OLD BENEFIT YEAR AND AT THE BEGINNING OF HIS NEW BENEFIT YEAR: AMENDING SECTION 39-51-2104+ PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 39-51-2104. MCA. is amended to 13 14 read:

#39-51-2104. General benefit eligibility conditions. An unemployed individual is eligible to receive benefits for any week of total unemployment within his benefit year only if the department finds that:

(1) he has registered for work at and thereafter has continued to report at an employment office in accordance with such regulation as the department may prescribe, except that the department may, by regulation, prescribe that in cases in which it finds such requirements oppressive or inconsistent with the purposes of this chapter. unemployed individual may register and report for work by mail or through other governmental agencies:

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(2) he has made a claim for benefits in accordance with the provisions of 39-51-2401:

(3) he is able to work and is available for work and is seeking work; provided, however, that no claimant is considered ineligible in any week of unemployment for failure to comply with the provisions of this subsection if such failure is due to an illness or disability which occurs after he has registered for work and no suitable work has been offered to such claimant after the beginning of such illness or disability:

(4) prior to any week for which he claims benefits he has been totally unemployed for a waiting period of 1 week. DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 215 provides a one-week waiting period between benefit years where an unemployment insurance claimant is in a compensable status at the end of his old benefit year and at the beginning of his new benefit year.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Total extended benefit (E.B.) payments for FY 84 = 35,000 and FY 85 = 32,000.
- Number of E. B. first benefit payments for FY 84 = 6,500 and FY 85 = 6,000.
- 3) Average weekly benefit amount for FY 84-\$138 and FY 85-\$150.
- 4) Extended benefit program expected to be triggered at 13 weeks each year.
