4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT RAISING THE MAXIMUM 5 MILL LEVY AUTHORIZED FOR A MUNICIPAL OR COUNTY PUBLIC 6 LIBRARY; AND AUTHORIZING A GOVERNING BODY TO EXCEED THE 7 MAXIMUM MILL LEVY FOR LIBRARY SERVICE UPON APPROVAL BY THE 8 VOTERS; AMENDING SECTION 22-1-304, MCA."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 11 Section 1. Section 22-1-304, MCA, is amended to read: 12 "22-1-304. Tax levy -- special library fund -- bonds. (1) The governing body of any city or county which has 13 established a public library may levy in the same manner and 14 15 at the same time as other taxes are levied a special tax in 16 the amount necessary to maintain adequate public library service, not to exceed 3.5 mills on the dollar, upon all 17 18 property in such county which may be levied by the governing 19 body of such county and not to exceed  $4-\frac{1}{2}$  mills on the dollar upon all property in such city which may be levied by 20 21 the governing body of such city.

(a) The governing body of any city or county may
by resolution submit the question of exceeding the maximum
tax levy provided in subsection (1) to a vote of the
qualified electors thereof at the next general election.

1	Such resolution must be adopted at least 60 days prior to
2	the general election at which the question will be voted on.
3	(b) Upon petition being filed with the governing body
4	and signed by not less than 5% of the resident taxpayers of
5	any city or county requesting an election for the purpose of
6	exceeding the maximum mill levy: the governing body shall
7	submit to a vote of the qualified electors thereof at the
8	next_general_election_the_guestion_of_exceeding_themaximum
9	mill levy. Such petition must be delivered to the governing
10	body at least 90 days prior to the general election at which
11	the question will be voted on.
12	(c) The question shall be submitted by ballots upon
13	which the words "FOR exceeding themill maximum levy
14	and authorizing an additional ease mill(s) for the eases
15	library" and "AGAINST exceeding the maximum
16	library levy" shall appear, with a square before each
17	proposition and a direction to insert an "X" mark in the
18	square before one or the other of the propositions.
19	(d) The votes cast for the adoption or rejection of
20	the guestion must be canvassed and:
21	(i) if a majority of the voters voting on the question
22	vote to exceed the maximum mill levy, the governing body
23	<u>shall levy the additional tax for the year in which the vote</u>
24	was taken: or
25	(ii) if a majority of the voters voting on the question

## 1 vote to not exceed the maximum mill levy, the maximum mill 2 levy may not be exceeded. (2) The proceeds of such tax shall constitute a 3 separate fund called the public library fund and shall not 4 be used for any purpose except those of the public library. 5 6 (3)(4) No money shall be paid out of the public library fund by the treasurer of the city or county except 7 by order or warrant of the board of library trustees. 8 9 (4)(5) Bonds may be issued by the governing body in the manner prescribed by law for the erection and equipment 10 11 of public library buildings and the purchase of land 12 therefor."
