4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REVISE THE METHOD 5 FOR FUNDING LOCAL PUBLIC LIBRARIES: TO ESTABLISH A COUNTY LIGRARY BUDGET BOARD COMPOSED OF TWO MEMBERS FROM LIBRARY 6 7 BOARDS OF TRUSTEES IN THE COUNTY AND THE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COUNTY R LIBRARY BUDGET BOARD SET A COUNTYWIDE MILL LEVY NOT TO Q 10 EXCEED 5 MILLS FOR THE SUPPORT OF PUBLIC LIBRARIES WITHIN 11 THE COUNTY; TO DELETE THE PRESENT CITY AND COUNTY MILL LEVIES FOR LIBRARIES: AMENDING SECTIONS 22-1-304+ 22-1-305+ 12 13 AND 22-1-309, MCA; REPEALING SECTIONS 22-1-315 AND 22-1-316, MCA, RELATING TO JOINT LIBRARY BOARDS; AND PROVIDING AN 14 EFFECTIVE DATE.* 15

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17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 18 <u>NEW SECTION</u> Section 1. County library budget board. 19 (1) There is a county library budget board in each county of 20 the state that has a public library.

(2) The county library budget board consists of the
county superintendent of schools and two members appointed
by the library boards of trustees in the county. The board
may elect officers from among its members. A majority vote
of all of the members of the county library budget board is

1 necessary to set the mill levy provided in subsection (3). 2 (3) The county library budget board shall determine a 3 mill levy, not to exceed 5 mills, for a countywide property 4 tax mill levy for the support of all public libraries within 5 the county. No later than August 15 of each year, the 6 county library budget board shall determine and certify to 7 the board of county commissioners the amount of mills to be 8 levied. Prior to determining the mill levy, the county 9 library budget board must conduct two public hearings on the 10 amount of the mill levy. The public hearings must be held 11 not later than 15 days and not earlier than 45 days prior to 12 the date the mill levy is determined.

13 (4) The county library budget board must determine the 14 allocation of the proceeds of the mill levy that each public 15 library in the county shall receive. Each library board of 16 trustees must budget the funds for its library.

17 Section 2. Section 22-1-304, MCA, is amended to read: "22-1-304. Tax levy -- special library fund -- bonds. 18 (1) The governing body of eny-city-or a county which has 19 20 established a public library or in which a city within the 21 county has established a public library may shall levy in 22 the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied a special tax in the amount necessary-to-maintain 23 24 adequate-public-library-service certified to them by the 25 county library budget board, not to exceed 3 5 mills on the

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dollar, upon all property in such county which may be levied
 by the governing body of such county and-not-to-exceed-4-1/2
 mills-on-the-dollar-upon-all-property-in-such-city-which-may
 be-levied-by-the-governing-body-of-such-city.

5 (2) The proceeds of such tax shall constitute a 6 separate fund called the public library fund and shall not 7 be used for any purpose except those of the public library. 8 (3) No money shall be paid out of the public library 9 fund by the treasurer of the city-or county except by order 10 or warrant of the board of library trustees.

11 (4) Bonds may be issued by the governing body in the 12 manner prescribed by law for the erection and equipment of 13 public library buildings and the purchase of land therefor." Section 3. Section 22-1-305, MCA, is amended to read: 14 15 "22-1-305. Library depreciation reserve fund authorized. The governing--body-of-any-city-or-county-or-a 16 17 combination-of-city-and-county--in--Nontana county_library 18 budget board may establish a library depreciation reserve 19 fund for the replacement and acquisition of property, capital improvements, and equipment necessary to maintain 20 and improve city, county, or city-county library services." 21 22 Section 4. Section 22-1-309, MCA, is amended to read: #22-1-309. Trustees -- powers and duties. The library 23 board of trustees shall have exclusive control of the 24 25 expenditure of the public library fund, of construction or

lease of library buildings, and of the operation and care of
 the library. The library board of trustees of every public
 library shall:

4 (1) adopt bylaws and rules for its own transaction of
5 business and for the government of the library, not
6 inconsistent with law;

7 (2) establish and locate a central public library and
8 may establish branches thereof at such places as are deemed
9 necessary;

10 (3) have the power to contract, including the right to 11 contract with regions, counties, cities, school districts, 12 educational institutions, the state library, and other 13 libraries, to give and receive library service, through the 14 boards of such regions, counties, and cities and the 15 district school boards, and to pay out or receive funds to 16 pay costs of such contracts;

(4) have the power to acquire, by purchase, devise,
lease or otherwise, and to own and hold real and personal
property in the name of the city or county or both, as the
case may be, for the use and purposes of the library and to
sell, exchange or otherwise dispose of property real or
personal, when no longer required by the library and to
insure the real and personal property of the library;

24 (5) pay necessary expenses of members of the library
25 staff when on business of the library;

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1 (6) prepare an annual budget, indicating what support 2 and maintenance of the public library will be required from 3 public funds, for submission to the appropriate agency of 4 the governing body. A separate budget request shall be 5 submitted for new construction or for capital improvement of 6 existing library property.

7 (7) make an annual report to the governing body of the 8 city or county on the condition and operation of the 9 library, including a financial statement. The trustees shall 10 also provide for the keeping of such records as shall be 11 required by the Montana state library in its request for an 12 annual report from the public libraries and shall submit 13 such an annual report to the state library.

(8) have the power to accept gifts, grants, donations, 14 devises, or bequests of property, real or personal, from 15 16 whatever source and to expend or hold, work, and improve the same for the specific purpose of the gift, grant, donation, 17 devise, or bequest. These gifts, grants, donations, devises, 18 and bequests shall be kept separate from regular library 19 20 funds and are not subject to reversion at the end of the 21 fiscal year.
