BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-3-106, MCA, is amended to read: "61-3-106. Report of stolen and recovered motor vehicles. It shall be the duty of the sheriff of every county of the state and of the chief of police or commissioner of police of every city to make an immediate report-to-the-division-of-all-motor-vehicles-reported-to-him as--statem--or--recoveredy--upon--forms--provided-for-by-the division entry regarding each yehicle theft or recovery into the state automated stolen vehicle file maintained by the department of justice. Failure on the part of any officer shall be considered to be misfeasance in office and shall constitute grounds for removal. Upon receipt entry of such information, the division shall-file-it-in-an--index--to--be

known--as--the-stolen-and-recovered-motor-vehicle-index must 1 be allowed immediate access to the state automated stolen 3 vehicle_file_and_the_national_crime_information_center. It shall also be the duty of the division to file reports of 5 stolen and recovered motor vehicles reported to it from other states. - (b) the name and complete address of the owner or the 9 names and addresses of joint owners;
- (c) except as provided in 61-3-103(2), the name and complete address of any holder of a perfected security 12 interest in the registered vehicle:
- 13 (d) a description of the registered vehicle; including 14 the year built and serial number;
- 15 (e) except as provided in 61-3-103(2), the filing date of any lien against such motor vehicle; and 16
- (f) such other statement of facts as may be determined 17 18 by the division.
 - (3) When the names and addresses of more than one owner who are members of the same immediate family are listed on the certificate of ownership, joint ownership with right of survivorship, and not as tenants in common, is presumed.
- (4) Upon receipt of the application, the division 24 25 shall recheck the application. If there is any error in the

application it may be returned to the country treasurer to effectively secure the correction of such empore who shall return the same to the division.

- (5) The certificate of ownership shall contain a notice to the division of a transfer of interest of the owner and such other statements as may be determined by the division.
- 161 (a) Any registered vehicle may be inspected for a vehicle identification number prior to issuance of a 10 certificate of ownership.
- 11 (b) The following vehicles must be inspected for a 12 vehicle identification number prior to issuance of a 13 certificate of ownership:
- 14 (i) used motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, and 15 travel trailers brought into the state:
- 16 (ii) new motor vehicles purchased outside the state;
- 17 and
- 18 (iii) reassembled vehicles.
- 19 (c) Inspections under this subsection must be 20 performed by the Montana highway patrol and documented on 21 forms provided by the division.
- 22 (d) Any enforcement officer of the Montana highway 23 patrol. with or without a warrant. may seize and take 24 possession of any motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or 25 travel trailer that the officer has probable cause to

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 385 changes the method of making and keeping reports of stolen and recovered vehicles; provides for inspection of vehicle identification numbers; allows seizure of vehicles; and provides for an inspection fee.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) This act will require approximately \$60,000 inspections per year.
- 2) Twelve additional highway patrol personnel will be needed to carry out the requirements of this act.
- 3) The effective date of the act is October 1 of FY 84.
- 4) A one month start-up time will be required prior to the effective date of the act.
