A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO PROHIBIT
APPROPRIATIONS BY LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS, SCHOOL DISTRICTS,
OR OTHER POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS OF THE STATE TO NONPROFIT
ORGANIZATIONS UNLESS THEY ARE ORGANIZED FOR SPECIFIC
PURPOSES AND HAVE UNITED STATES INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE
RECOGNITION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Local appropriations to nonprofit
organization. No local government unit, school district, or
other subdivision of the state may appropriate money to any
nonprofit organization that is organized and operated for
religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational
purposes, for testing for public safety, or for the
prevention of cruelty to children or animals unless that
organization provides to the appropriating entity its exempt
organization number issued by the United States Internal
revenue service under the provisions of section 501(c)(3) of
the Internal Revenue Code.

Section 2. Codification instruction. Section 1 is
intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 7,
chapter 6, parts 23 and 42, and Title 20, chapter 9, part 2.
